How to Find an article in the EBSCO databases

- Go to the library home page (<u>http://libguides.middlesex.mass.edu/library</u>)
- Find the link <u>All of our databases</u> in the center panel and click
- Locate EBSCO in the list of databases



We suggest you start with Masterfile and Academic Search for most topics.



Depending on your results you might want to limit to only articles available in full-text, a specific journal or local information available at Middlesex. The local information option is useful when only a citation is available in EBSCO but the library has a copy of the periodical on its shelf.



Click on the search button next to the terms you entered. The search results will retrieve full text articles which can be printed or emailed to your home.
