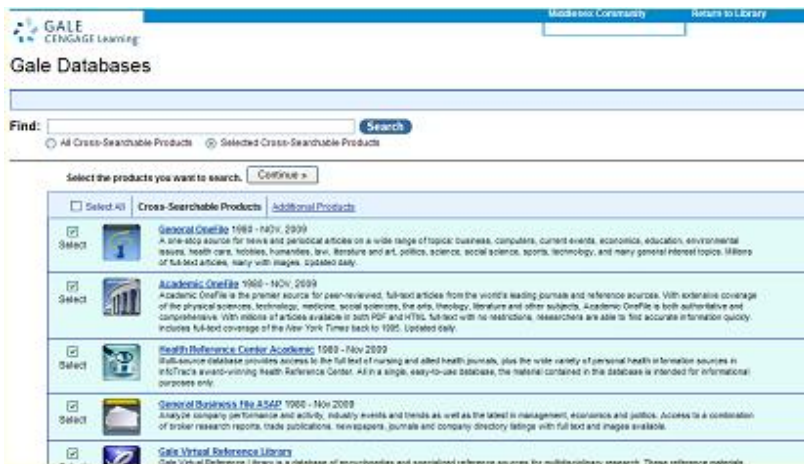




How to find an article in a Gale database

- Connect to **Blackboard**.
- **Login** to your account.
- Click on the **library tab**.
- From the menu on the left hand side select **Electronic Resources**.
- Select **Gale** from the database list.

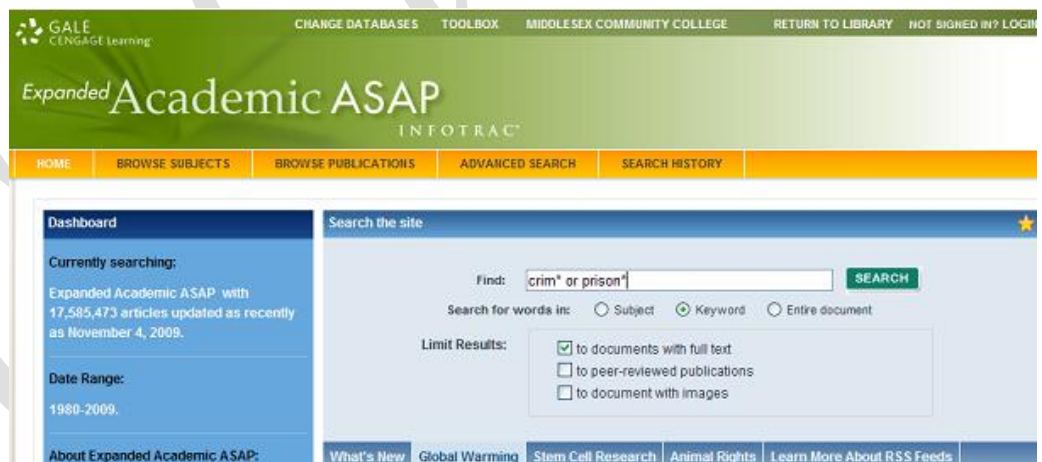
From here you will be presented with a list of Gale databases



We suggest you begin with **Expanded Academic** or **General Reference Center** for most searches.

Enter your search term in the box provided. It will look for your terms in the title, summary, or subject of an article.

The results will contain any available reference books, newspaper and magazine articles that mention your search term. The results will be listed in date order, newest ones first. For more information about searching hints, combining terms and using wildcards click [here](#).



Browse Subjects Enter a single search term in the search box provided or browse to your topic using the index. SUBJECT SEARCH results will contain available reference books, newspaper and magazine articles where your search term is a major topic. If you click on the + sign your topic will be further divided by a number of **Subdivisions**, that breakdown your topic into narrower, more focused categories. If you click on **related subjects** you will find suggested subjects that link to additional materials with a broader or narrower focus.

Our databases include citations, abstracts and complete articles. To limit your search to items which contain the entire article click **limit the results to documents with full text**.

From the results list you can click on **Full-text** or **PDF** to see the entire article.
